Changes to the Concessionary Fares Scheme – have your say 14th June

The Department for Infrastructure (Dfl) is carrying out a consultation on Changes to Concessionary Fares which you will be aware provides free and discounted public transport for some groups of people, including older people. The consultation is likely to launch in early June and will be open for a period of 12 weeks.

Dfl is holding an online Focus Group aimed at Age Sector Networks, Age Friendly Coordinators, and members of the Frailty Network on **Wednesday 14 June, 10am – 11.30am**, so that you can hear from those leading the review process and contribute directly to the consultation.

Dfl have let us know that only 15 places are available for this meeting, so we will go with the first 15 to express an interest in attending. However, you might be interested to know:

- Dfl is holding a separate meeting with Age Nl's Consultative Forum;
- They have indicated to us that they will hold other meetings open to the public;
- Dfl will launch an online consultation survey on their website and will share the link with us as soon as it is live.
